Welcome

This training is a station in the Equipping Track, our church's process for developing people into fully devoted followers of Christ. Since these training opportunities build on each other it is best to attend "Welcome to the Family" (being committed to Christ and the New Song Family) before taking this training. We are convinced that those commitments of Membership and Maturity are the foundation for Ministry.

The Purpose for this Training

"(God) has given... pastors and teachers to prepare God's people for works of ministry, so the body of Christ may be built up."

Ephesians 4:11-12

- The Pastors are responsible for EQUIPPING
- The People are responsible for MINISTRY

The Underlying Principle for this Training

What God made you to BE determines what He intends for you to DO. You will understand the purpose you were created for when you understand the kind of person you are. This is the secret of knowing God's will for your life.

God is consistent in his plan for each of our lives. He would not give us inborn talents and temperaments, spiritual gifts, and all sorts of life experiences and then not use them. By reviewing and studying these factors, we can discover the ministry God has for us.... the unique way God intends for us to serve him.

The two results of discovering your SHAPE are:

- Fruitfulness
- Fulfillment

The Focus of this Training

At New Song, we focus on an individual and a church body approach to ministry.

- 1. That we will discover our unique design (S.H.A.P.E.) for ministry and commit to developing our God given gifts and abilities in serving God and others through our church family and beyond.
- 2. That we will select and begin serving in ministries that best express who we are in Christ, who we are as individuals, and how we make up the church body.

What is Ministry?

Ministry is using whatever God has given me to serve him and the needs of others.

We Serve in 3 Directions

To the Lord (Acts 13:2)
 To other believers (Hebrews 6:10)
 To un-believers (Matthew 5:13)

We Serve to 3 Areas of Need

• To people's physical needs.

"(God says) I was hungry and you fed me ... thirsty and you gave me a drink... needed clothes and you clothed me... sick and you cared for me... in prison and you visited me... Whenever you have done this to the least person, you did it to me."

The Priority of Ministry

(Why should you be interested?)

You have been created for ministry.

"For we are God's workmanship, created in Christ Jesus to do good works, which God prepared in advance for us to do."

2. You have been saved for ministry.

"Who saved us and called us to a holy calling, not because of our works but because of his own purpose and grace, which he gave us in Christ Jesus before the ages began"

2 Timothy 1:9

3. You have been called for ministry.

"But when he who had set me apart before I was born and who called me by his grace,"

"I urge you to live a life worthy of the calling you have received."

How to Discover Your Ministry

(Romans 12:1-8)

STEP 1: Dedicate your being

"I urge you...to offer yourselves as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God - which is your spiritual worship." (vs. 1)

STEP 2: Consecrate your focus

"Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind." (vs. 2)

STEP 3: Evaluate your strengths

"Don't cherish exaggerated ideas of yourself or your importance, but try to have a sane estimate of your capabilities by the light of the faith God has given to you." (vs. 3 Ph)

STEP 4: Cooperate with other believers

"Just as each of us has one body with many members, and these members do not all have the same function, so in Christ we who are many form one Body, and each member belongs to all the others." (vs. 4-5)

Implications from Paul's Anatomy Lesson

(See also I Corinthians 12:1-31)

- Every member is a minister in Christ's body.
- Every member has a different function.
- Every member's ministry is important.
- Every member belongs to the others.

"Each of us is apart of the one Body of Christ... The eye can never say to the hand, 'I don't need you.' The head cannot say to the feet, 'I don't need you.' And some of the parts that seem weakest and least important are really the most necessary!... So God put the body together in such a way that extra honor and care are given to those parts that might otherwise seem less important."

1 Corinthians 12:13,21-22, 24b (LB)

STEP 5: Activate your gifts

"We have different gifts, according to the grace God has given us...prophesy.. serving... teaching... encouraging... contributing... leadership...showing mercy..."

Romans 12:6-8

Discovering How God has SHAPE'd You for Ministry

How Has God Shaped You?

"Your hands formed and shaped me..."

Job 10:8a (GN)

God has been molding and shaping you for ministry since you were born. In fact, God started uniquely shaping you even before you were born.

"Thank you for making me so wonderfully complex! It is amazing to think about. Your workmanship is marvelous ... You were there while I was being formed ... You saw me before I was born and scheduled each day of my life before I began to breathe."

- 1. You were shaped for a purpose.

In Ministry... Function follows Form!

"There are different kinds of SPIRITUAL GIFTS but the same Spirit gives them. There are different WAYS OF SERVING, but the same Lord is served. There are different ABILITIES to perform service, but the same God gives ability to everyone for their service. The Spirit's presence is shown IN SOME WAY in each one, for the good of all."

Your S.H.A.P.E. Will Determine Your Ministry

Spiritual Gifts

"...Each man has his own gift from God; one has this gift, another has that."

1 Corinthians 7:7b

What The Bible Says About Spiritual Gifts

"Now about spiritual gifts I do not want you to be ignorant."

A Spiritual Gift: It is a divine ability, given by the Holy Spirit to every believer, to be used to minister to others and therefore build up the Body of Christ.

The Purpose of Spiritual Gifts

A. Not for personal benefit, but for others.

"Each one of you, as a good manager of God's different gifts, must use for the good of others, the spiritual gift he has received from God."

1 Peter 4:10 (GN)

"The Holy Spirit displays God's power through each of us as a means of helping the entire church."

1 Corinthians 12:7 (LB)

B. To produce maturity and stability in our church family.

"It was He who 'gave gifts to men'... to build up the Body of Christ so we shall all come together to that oneness in our faith... and become mature... Then we shall no longer be children, carried by the waves and blown about by every shifting wind..."

Ephesians 4:11,13-14 (GN)

Cautions About Spiritual Gifts

- 1. Don't confuse gifts with natural talents
- 2. Don't confuse gifts with the Fruit of the Spirit (Gal.5:22-23)
 - "Fruit" show my Maturity
 - "Gifts" show my Ministry.
- 3. Don't confuse gifts with Christian roles
- Be aware of the "gift projection" tendency (Expecting others to serve the way you do and have similar results)
- 5. Don't feel your gifts makes you superior to others (1 Cor. 12:21)
- 6. Realize that using your gifts without love is worthless

"I may be able to speak the languages of men and even of angels... I may have the gift of inspired preaching... I may have all knowledge... and all the faith to move mountains - but if I have not love, I am nothing....it does no good."

Corinthians 13:1-3 (GN)

- 7. Recognize that you have both a Primary and Additional ministries in your church:
 - Your primary ministry commitment should be in the area where you are gifted
 - Your additional ministries include serving in any other area of the Body when you are needed (Titus 3:14)

Monitoring Your Heartbeat

heart (hahrt) noun

- 1. hollow, pumplike organ of blood circulation, composed mainly of rhythmically contractile smooth muscle, located in the chest between the lungs and slightly to the left and consisting of four chambers
- 2. the center of the total personality, especially with reference to intuition, feeling, or emotion
- 3. the vital force or driving impulse

The Bible uses the term "heart" to represent the center of your motivation, desires, and inclinations.

"Delight yourself in the Lord and he will give you the desires of your heart."

Isaiah 37:4

• Why you say the things you say For out of the abundance of the heart the mouth speaks.

- Why you feel the way you do
 "The Word of God...examines the thoughts and motives of the heart."

Your Heart Is the Real You!

Physiologically, each of us has a unique heartbeat. Each person has a slightly different pattern. Likewise, God has given each of us a unique emotional "heartbeat" that races when we encounter activities, subjects, or circumstances that interest us. We instinctively feel deeply about some things and not about others.

This God-given heart is often at the center of your motivation. It determines what your interests are, and what will bring you the most satisfaction and fulfillment. It also motivates you to pursue certain activities, subjects, and environments.

Why has God Given Each Person a Unique Heartbeat?

God had a purpose in giving you your inborn interests. In fact, your emotional heartbeat reveals a very important key to understanding God's design and intention for your life.

The Bible makes very clear that your heart was designed by God, but you make the choice to use it for good or evil, for selfish purposes or for service.

You may have...

"	.selfish	ambition in	your heart	. " James 3:14	4

Or you may...

"Serve the Lord with all your heart."	1 Sam. 12:20
" Do the will of God from your heart."	Eph. 6:6

How can I do God's will and serve God's purpose? By letting my heartbeat motivate me for ministry.

Applying Your Abilities

"I (God)... have given him skill, ability, and knowledge in all kinds of crafts..."

Exodus 31:3

"For as in one body we have many members, and the members do not all have the same function, so we, though many, are one body in Christ, and individually members one of another."

Romans 12:4-5

One of the most common excuses people give for not getting involved in ministry is "I just don't have any abilities to offer." Nothing could be further from the truth. The key is matching your abilities with the right ministry.

Five Misconceptions About Abilities (Skills and Talents)

- 1. **MYTH**: People aren't born with skills. All skills must be learned by experience. This simply is not true. There are a number of skills which seem to be inborn, or are developed very early in infancy. When people say "They just seems to have a natural talent for it" it's probably true.
- 2. **MYTH**: Those skills which must be learned, are learned primarily in the classroom. Actually, some of your most basic skills were learned at home, in the street, or somewhere else outside the classroom.
- 3. **MYTH**: If you have certain abilities, you will be very aware that you have them. Again, this is not true. You are probably using a number of talents or skills that you are not even aware of. You need some process of skill identification.
- 4. **MYTH**: Skills that I use at work are only useful in that environment. I couldn't use them in ministry. Hopefully, by the end of this training, you'll see the fallacy of this idea. Be creative.
- 5. **MYTH**: Most people only have a very few abilities. The truth is that many national studies have proven that the average person possesses many more abilities that can be used to server other than they realize. Some studies have suggested people have 100s of abilities.

What Happened?

When you tried to do something that was not natural to you...

- 1. You felt uncomfortable.
- It took extra time and effort.
- 3. You still did a lousy job at it.

The same things are true when we try to minister in areas that are not suited to our personality. God has wired your temperament in a unique way. This factor is very important in matching you to the right ministry.

It's obvious that God has not used a cookie cutter to stamp out people in a process of uniformity. He loves variety- just look around. And there is no "right" or "wrong" temperament. We need opposites to balance the church.

Examining Your Experiences

One of the most overlooked factors in determining the ministry God has for you is your past experience. Earning your GED, raising a child, being a counselor at youth camp, working on a farm, all equip you to serve others.

One of the most overlooked factors in determining the ministry God has for you is your past experience, particularly your hurts and problems you've overcome with God's help. Since our greatest life messages come out of our weaknesses, not our strengths, we should pay close attention to what we've learned in the "school of hard knocks." God never wastes a hurt.

He wants to use you to minister to people who are experiencing what you have already experienced.

"For we are his workmanship..."

"(God)... wonderfully comforts and strengthens us in our hardships and trials. And why does he do this? So that when others are troubled, needing our sympathy and encouragement, we can pass on to them the same help and comfort God has given us!"

We Believe...

About Ministry

- Salvation in Jesus Christ automatically includes a call to ministry.
 Every believer is created, saved, called, gifted, authorized, and commanded to minister.
- Ministry is the heart of the Christian life. (Matt. 20:28)
- Function follows form in ministry. How God made me determines my primary ministry. God has uniquely shaped each individual.
- Everyone is a "10" in some area. Everyone has something to offer.
 Developing and using your SHAPE is good stewardship and of worship.
- You confirm your SHAPE through participation in ministry, instead of selecting your ministry solely by identifying your SHAPE.
- The evidence of the right match between my "SHAPE" and my ministry is fruitfulness and fulfillment.

About the Body of Christ

- God intends for ministry to be performed through the context of the local church. Membership includes a commitment to ministry.
- The Holy Spirit has provided our church body with the spirituallygifted people needed to do the work He wants done. Our task is to discover, enlist, train, and support these people in ministry.
- The church is to operate on the basis of SHAPE, rather than elected offices.

- The church is a family, not a business; an organism, not an organization. Therefore we streamline the structure in order to maximize ministry and minimize maintenance. We do not bury ministries under procedures.
- The mobilization of every member as a minister is the key to balanced growth of the church.
- The greater good of the whole Body must always take priority over the needs of any single ministry. There is no place for "turfism" in God's Family.

About the Role of Leadership

- The equipping of the members for ministry is the number one priority of Leadership. (Ephesians 4:11-12)
- The objective of New Song is to have an army of ministers who are maximizing their unique SHAPE in a meaningful service through our church.
- Each ministry leader is to provide training, encouragement, guidance, feedback and resources to the ministers under his or her care.

On Diversity of Ministry

- We have unity without uniformity. We believe diversity in ministries simply illustrates the unique giftedness of individuals.
- We encourage everyone to use their unique SHAPE to fulfill God's purpose as a need arises.
- Your primary ministry commitment should be in the area where you are SHAPE'd. Additional ministries include serving in any other area of the Body where you are needed. You are not ready for ministry, until you are a willing servant.

About Performance

- We expect people to do their best in ministry, not perfection. God deserves our best.
- We encourage creativity and innovation in ministry, which assumes things will not always turn out exactly as planned. And that is OK, we learn and go forward.
