General Overview of the Bible:

- ✓ Big Picture: the Bible is God's true story of His relationship with mankind. There are four themes in the total history that are also repeated as sub-themes throughout.
 - 1. Creation
 - 2. The Fall
 - 3. Redemption
 - 4. Restoration/ Reconciliation

✓ Layout of the Bible:

The Bible, though considered one book, is a volume of 66 books in two "testaments," 39 in the Old and 27 in the New. "Testament" means Covenant or Promise.

Old Testament is the record of God's dealings with man before Christ, B.C.

- 1. Books of the **Law**, also known as the Pentateuch or Torah *Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, Numbers, Deuteronomy*
- 2. Books of **History**.

Joshua, Judges, Ruth, 1-2 Samuel, 1-2 Kings, 1-2 Chronicles, Ezra, Nehemiah, Esther

3. Books of **Poetry**.

Job, Psalms, Proverbs, Ecclesiastes, Song of Songs

4. Books of **Prophecy**.

Major Prophets: Isaiah, Jeremiah, Lamentations, Ezekiel, Daniel

Minor Prophets: Hosea, Joel, Amos, Obadiah, Jonah, Micah, Nahum, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggi, Zechariah, Malachi

The books categorized as "Major" are longer and have broader content. "Minor" prophets are shorter and tend to be addressed to specific situations.

New Testament is the record of God's dealings with man after Christ, **A.D.** (Ano Domoni, Latin for "in the year of our Lord").

1. Books of **History**.

Matthew, Mark, Luke, John, Acts

2. Paul's Letters or Epistles.

Romans, 1-2 Corinthians, Galatians, Ephesians, Philippians, Colossians, 1-2 Thessalonians, 1-2 Timothy, Titus, Philemon

3. General Letters or Epistles.

Hebrews, James, 1-2 Peter, 1-3 John, Jude

4. Book of **Prophecy**.
